Objectives of the SRC

Objectives assigned to the SRC:

- 1) Strengthen the composition and functioning of the sub-regional working group so that it can create a sub-regional coordination body and set up a supervision group
- 2) In consultation with the working group, finalise the sub-regional charter
- 3) Strengthen the activities of the sub-regional platform, in particular its engagement within the framework of political dialogue at the sub-regional level (in collaboration with the SRC for ESA)
- 4) Coordinate and prepare multi-CP meetings / workshops / events, compile and disseminate reports on these events at sub-regional and regional levels (in collaboration with SRC for ESA)

Achievements from the last IPW to date (2/2)

Regionalisation Process

- African Regional Partners Workshop
- SULCI-FaNS annual meeting
- Meetings to discuss regionalisation (IST, POG, Friends of Prolinnova)

Backstopping

- Zoom meetings with CPs
- Identification of CPs' needs
- Attempts to revive dormant CPs
- Attempts to help set up new CPs

Documentation

Monitoring of activities (Skype meetings)



Issues and challenges

At CP level

- Covid-19 restrictions impeded the possibility of travelling and face-to-face backstopping of CPs
- Difficulty to interact with Mali (several emails sent but no response)
- Sometimes delay in answers to emails
- Dormant CPs (Niger, Nigeria) didn't express any interest to revive their national platforms

At sub-regional level

- Covid-19 restrictions impeded the possibility of international face-to-face gatherings
- Few funding opportunities that match well with Prolinnova principles and objectives
- Enrolling new partners that share the vision of Prolinnova
- The SR taskforce is not very responsive.



Opportunities for improvement (1/2)

At CP level

- Continue the Skype/Zoom interactions and envisage a physical backstopping (after restrictions lifted)
- Mali ???? BIG ISSUE !!!!!!!!!!
- CPs should designate some staff members to deal with certain issues (funding, networking, etc.)
- Continue trying to revive dormant
 CPs/backstopping where the possibilities exist

At sub-regional level

- Continue with virtual meetings until restrictions are lifted for cross-border gatherings
- Attempt connection with donors for directly negotiated funding instead of calls
- Engage in policy dialogue and influencing more efficiently to involve partners
- Revive the SR taskforce and shift to a SR Oversight Group



Opportunities for improvement (2/2)

At CP level

- Development of a national networking and fundraising strategy
- Development of a communication strategy to support policy influencing and advocacy
- CPs to develop their policy dialogue/advocacy plans for their projects (SULCI-FaNS, ProliGEAFaSa, FaReNe, EVM, etc.)

At sub-regional level

- Development of a SR networking and fundraising strategy
- Development of a SR communication strategy to support the policy influencing and advocacy
- Develop multi-CP initiatives with the support of the SR Oversight Group, IST and POG



Perspectives for development

- SR Charter approved and signed by the different parties
- Set up the SR bodies
- Develop a SR fundraising and networking strategy
- Reinforce the **cross-learning** within CPs
- Training of CPs and NSCs to strengthen their capacities in networking and resource mobilisation
- Backstopping to CPs (Mali, Cameroon)
- Revive dormant CPs (Niger, Nigeria)
- Assist countries wanting to set up their national CPs (Benin, Gambia, Guinea, Togo)
